Policies vs Bylaws

- Bylaws are general statements of goals and purpose.
- Bylaws are adopted by the entire membership, usually with a 2/3 majority.



Policies

- Record operations and procedures.
- Supplement the bylaws
- Adopted by the branch board of directors

Purposes of A Policy Document

1. Clarifies

2. Tells details of procedures and practices

Purpose May Be Stated

"The Policy Book of AAUW Ohio shall

- 1. Describe duties and responsibilities of officers, chairs, and members of committees
- 2. Clarify state/branch relationships to prevent inconsistency
- 3. Improve administration efficiency"

Examples of Policies of Branches

1. The board is responsible for approving all proposed branch projects after first reviewing the costs in time and funds required. These projects will then be presented to the branch as board recommendations.

Branch Policy Example 2

 Each board member shall prepare an annual report of activities performed during the last year. She/he shall give one copy to the branch president and retain one copy in her/his job file.



Branch Policy Example 3

"JOB DUTIES OF ELECTED OFFICERS AND NOMINATION CRITERIA OF PRESIDENT

The president will be elected from those branch members who have had recent board experience.

The president is responsible for appointing non-elected members of the board, leading meetings, and preparing the agenda. She/he also ensures that information is disseminated to board members and that branch affairs run smoothly.

The president serves as a non-voting, ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee, and is expected to attend these meetings. It is the duty of the committee chair to notify the president of each meeting..."

AAUW Ohio Board of Directors Policy Book May 2015

This Policy Book supplements the *AAUW Ohio Bylaws* and interprets decisions of the board of directors and annual meetings. It is subordinate to the AAUW and state bylaws. It must be read along with the *AAUW Ohio Bylaws* definitions of "authorized communications equipment" and "written communication." It shall be distributed to state board members and to the Ohio branches.

PURPOSE
